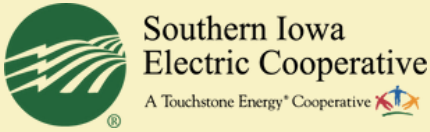

UNCLAIMED CAPITAL CREDITS

One advantage of belonging to a rural electric cooperative is receiving your share of Capital Credits. Any earnings left over after all expenses and/or reserves are paid are allocated back to members as Capital Credits. Capital Credits represent your share of the ownership and become part of the capital investment in your cooperative. Capital Credit allocations are based on the cooperative principle of business at cost. The following is a list of former members whose checks have either been returned to us or not cashed.
