
Community Fund Committee

Change the batteries in your smoke alarms and CO detectors.



Daylight Savings Time begins March 8th. After you change your clocks 🕒, go change the batteries 🔋 in your smoke and CO detectors as well. A quick check could save a life!

SECURE EQUIPMENT

Stay safe! Ensure that all outside equipment is secured before a storm approaches.



If a trampoline is not properly staked to the ground, high winds can lift it into power lines. Because trampolines are made of aluminum, removing them safely can be tedious AND dangerous. Keep everyone safe! Make sure your trampoline is properly grounded and consider using sandbags as a low-cost option.

Director Nominations: How To Get Involved

As a member-owner of SIEC, you have a level of local control that many utility consumers do not. Members may seek consideration as a candidate for the Board of Directors and may also nominate fellow members for consideration. Each member has the right to vote for Director candidates at the Annual Meeting, scheduled for September 3, 2026. A nominating committee will be appointed by the Board of Directors in March, with nominations opening shortly thereafter. Directors whose terms expire in 2026 include Dave Yahnke, Earl Trachsel, and Ryan Davis. To be considered, letters or emails must be received by SIEC no later than April 15, 2026. A ballot listing all nominated candidates will be mailed to members along with the official notice of the Annual Meeting. Members may return their ballots by mail or cast their vote in person at the Annual Meeting on September 3, 2026.
